***CSI In West Branch*, a presentation by Police Chief Mike Horihan Herbert Hoover Presidential Library-Museum**

West Branch, Iowa - The City of West Branch Police Chief Mike Horihan will present a Power Point talk, *CSI In West Branch*, on Saturday, June 18 at 10 a.m. in the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library-Museum Figge Auditorium. The talk will discuss how forensic science is used by modern law enforcement in solving crimes, especially as it pertained to solving the kidnapping of baby Kayden Powell in February 2014. The talk is free and open to the public. A table will be available in the lobby following the talk where children can make ink impressions of their fingerprints to take home with them. There will be regular admission charged for visitors wanting to see the museum galleries.

Chief Mike Horihan assumed his post in fall of 2011. A retired Iowa State Patrol trooper with 34 years of law enforcement experience as firearms instructor, crisis negotiator, and safety education officer, Horihan also served for three years as a military police officer in the United States Army. He is a graduate of the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy.

Currently on display at the Hoover Museum is the temporary exhibit, *Ain't Misbehavin'? The World of Gangsters*. This exhibit examines the use of fingerprints in the early 1900s. In 1924 the task of managing the fingerprint collections was taken over by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. An early fingerprinting kit, on loan from the FBI, is part of the *Ain't Misbehavin'?* display.
